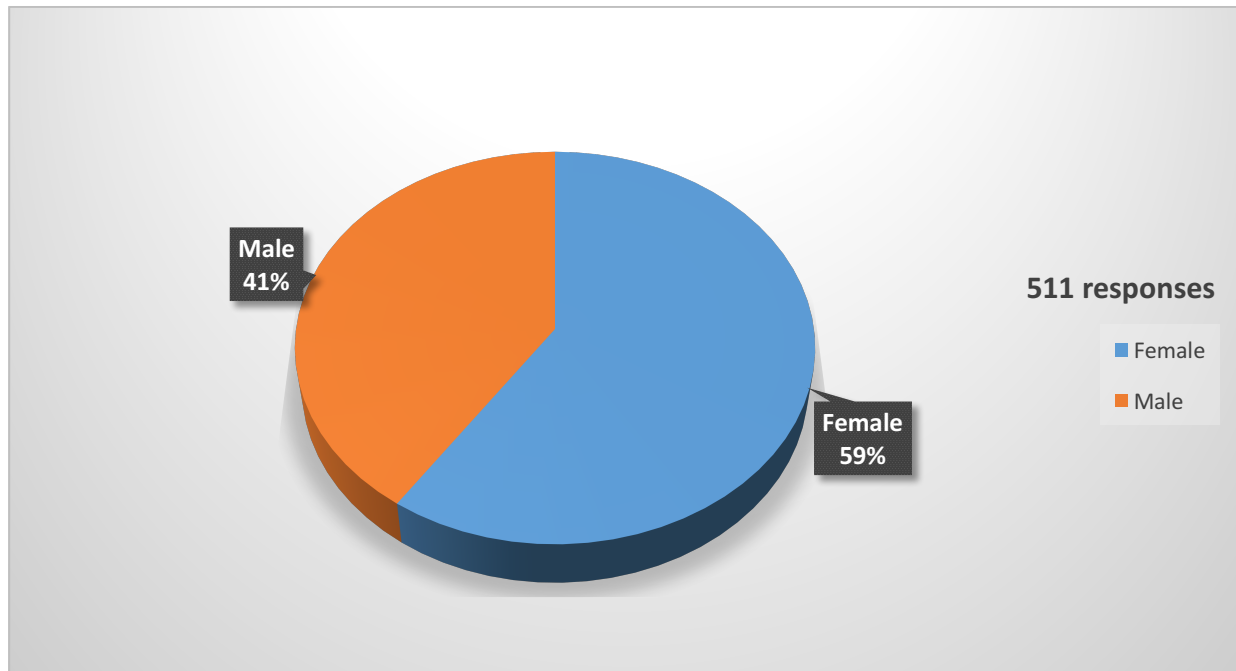

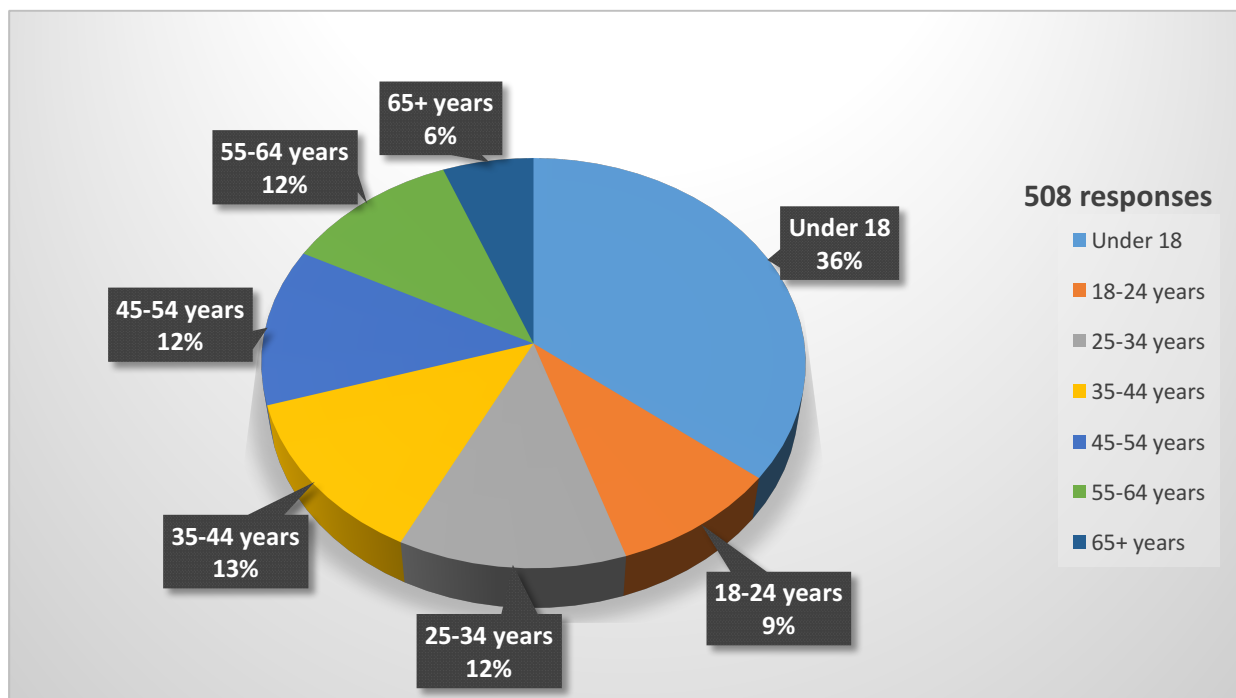
The Miami County Systems Of Care Governance Coalition created and distributed a Community Needs Assessment within the community of Miami County, IN. All questions presented in the assessment were created by and agreed upon through the Systems Of Care Governance Coalition. The distribution dates for the assessment were January 9, 2017 through February 6, 2017. Areas the assessment were distributed ranged from community food pantries, local school corporations, to those receiving services from providers. Individual responses were recorded as they were written, and raw data can be obtained upon request.

A copy of the assessment as well as the data collected can be found in this report.

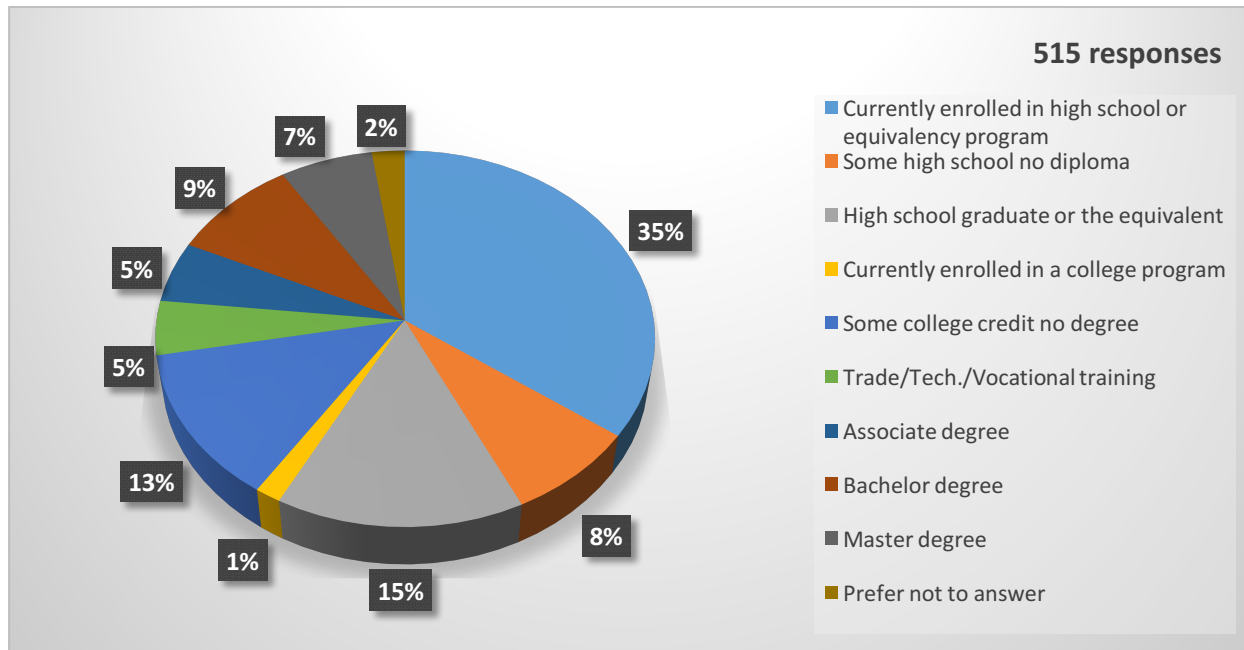
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 1.**
"Please specify your gender"



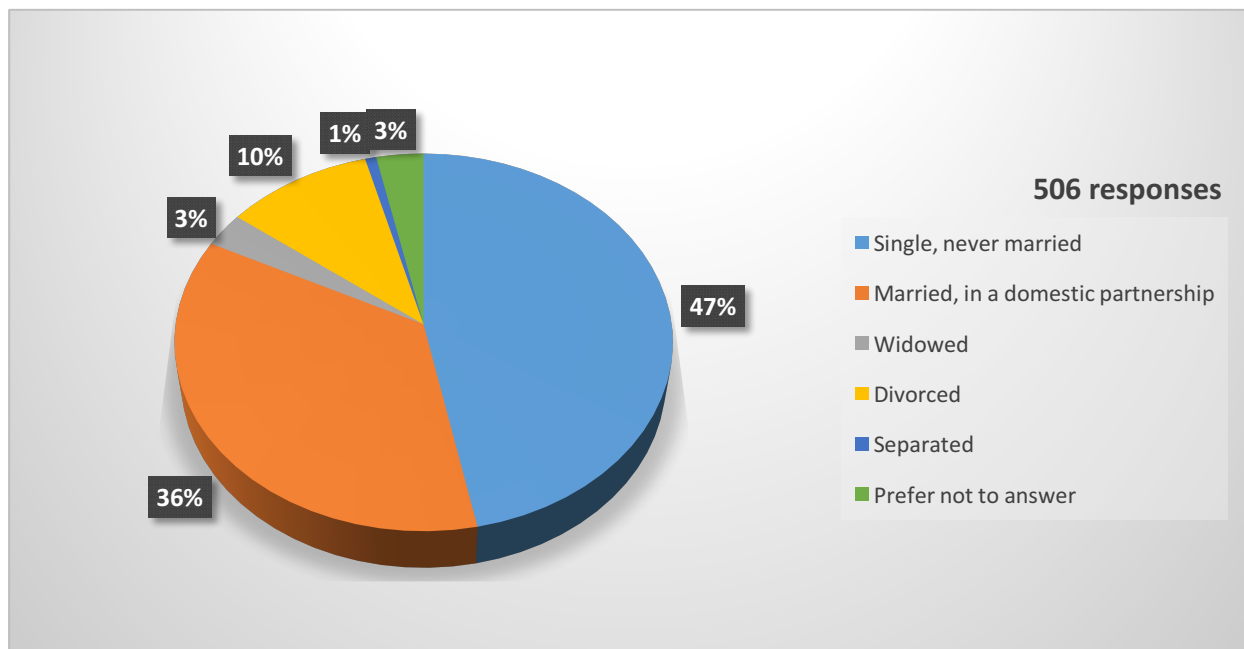
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 2.**
"Please specify your age range"



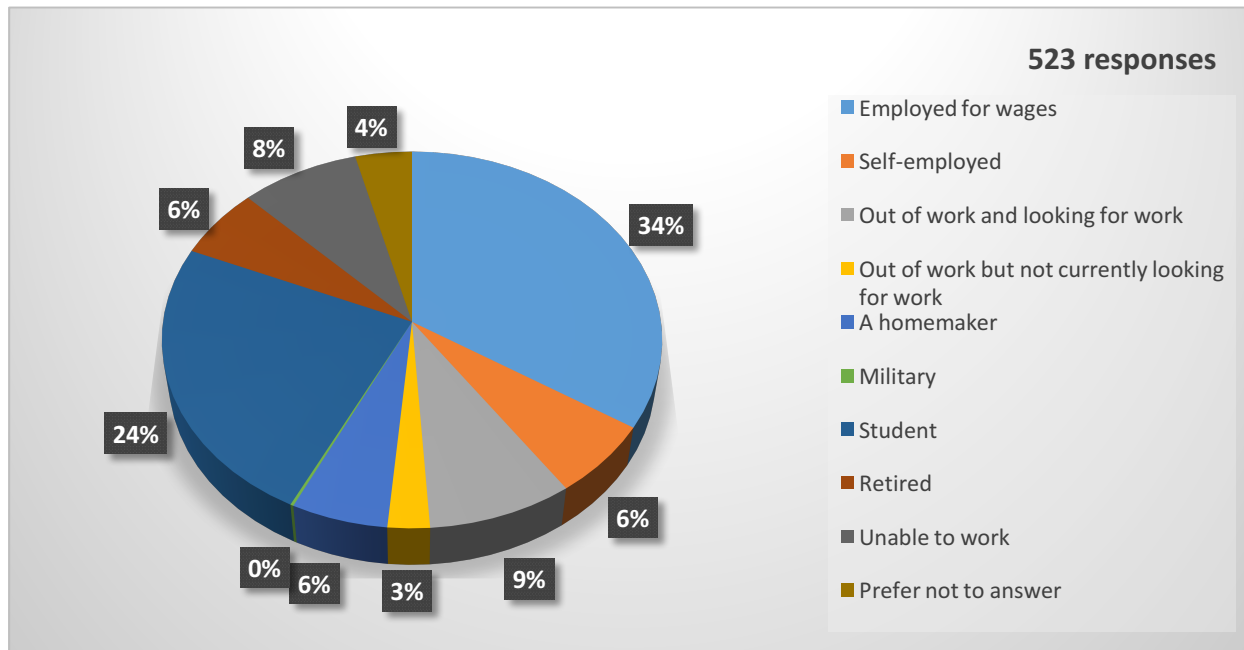
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 3.**
“What is the highest degree or level of school you have completed?”



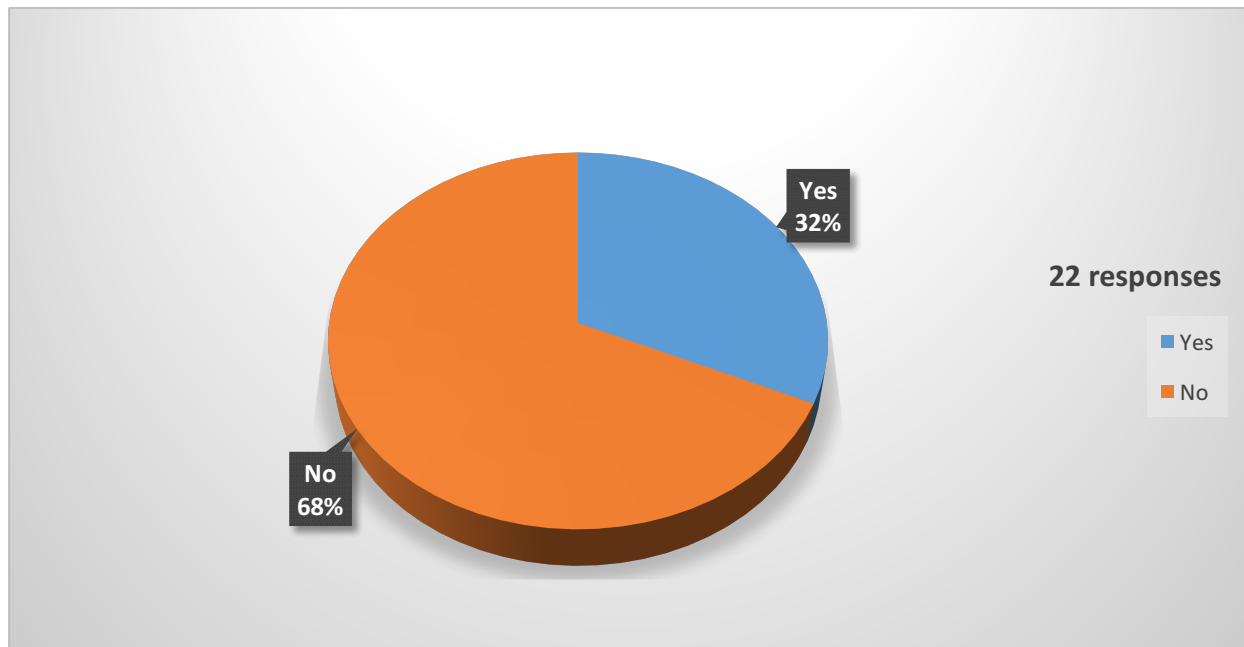
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 4.**
“What is your marital status? Please chose one that best fits your current situation”



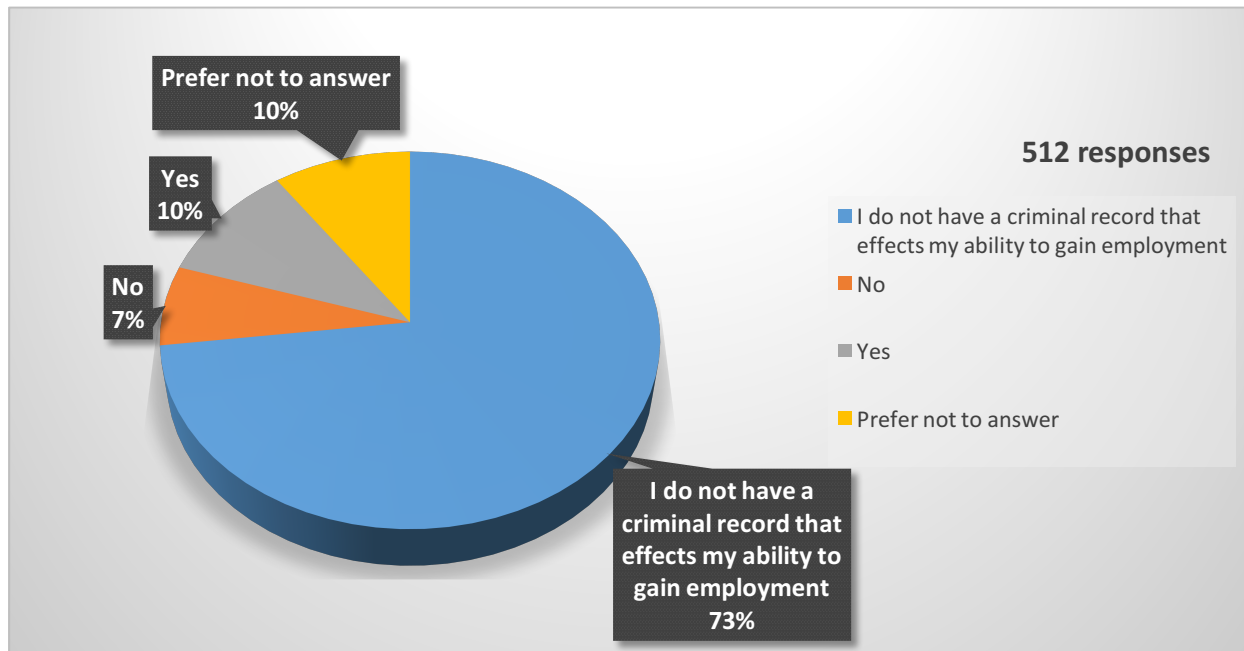
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 5**.
“Please specify your employment status: Are you currently”



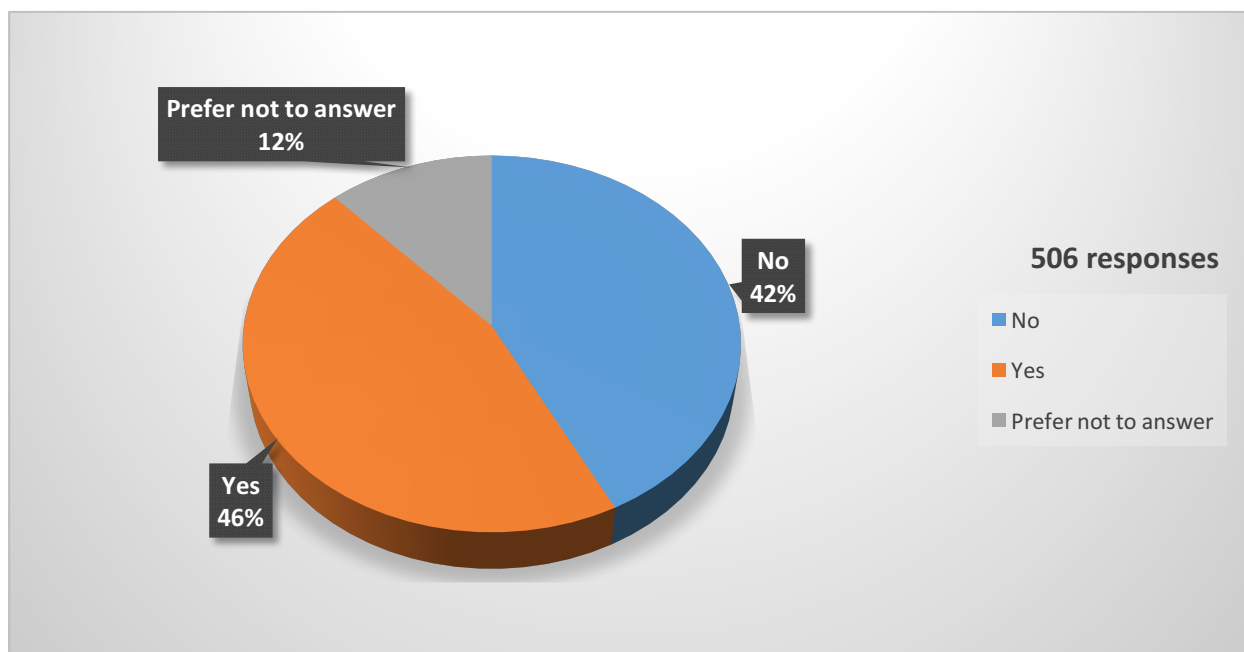
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 5 section-2**.

“Do you believe if your criminal record were expunged (removed completely) you may find employment?”

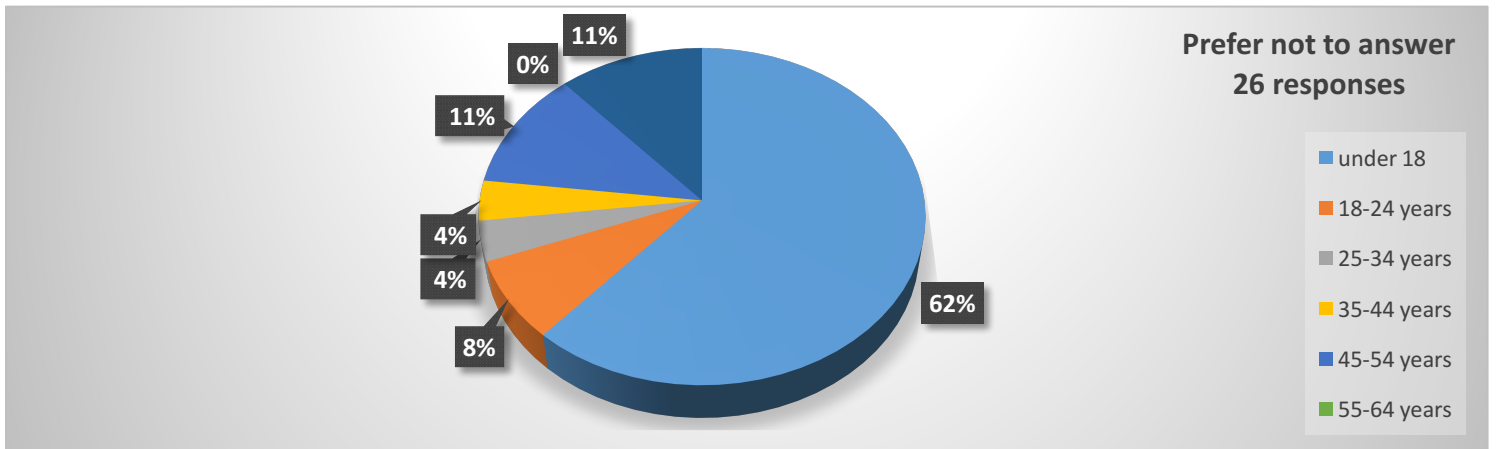
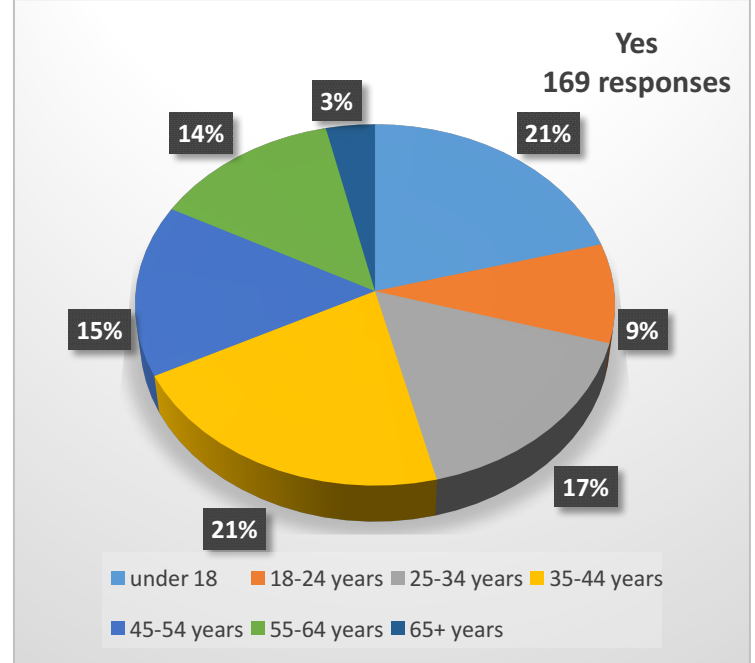
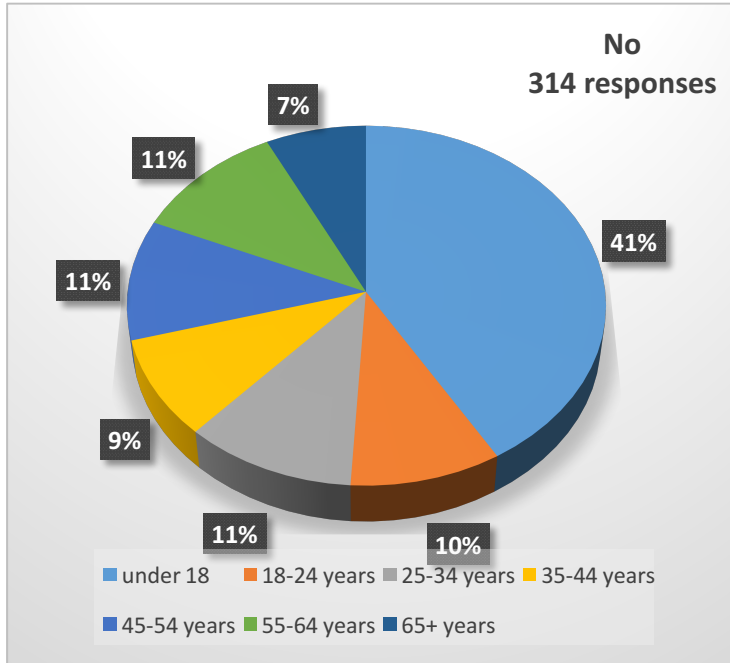

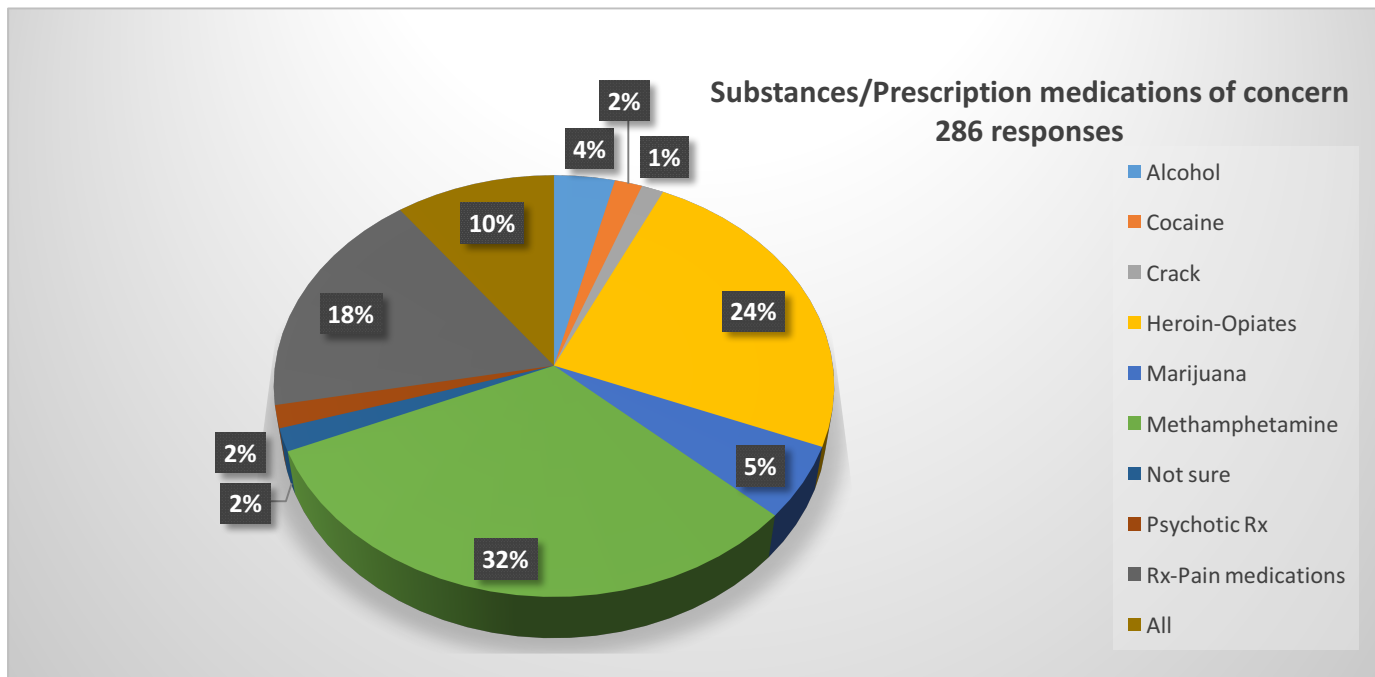
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment **question 10- section 1.**

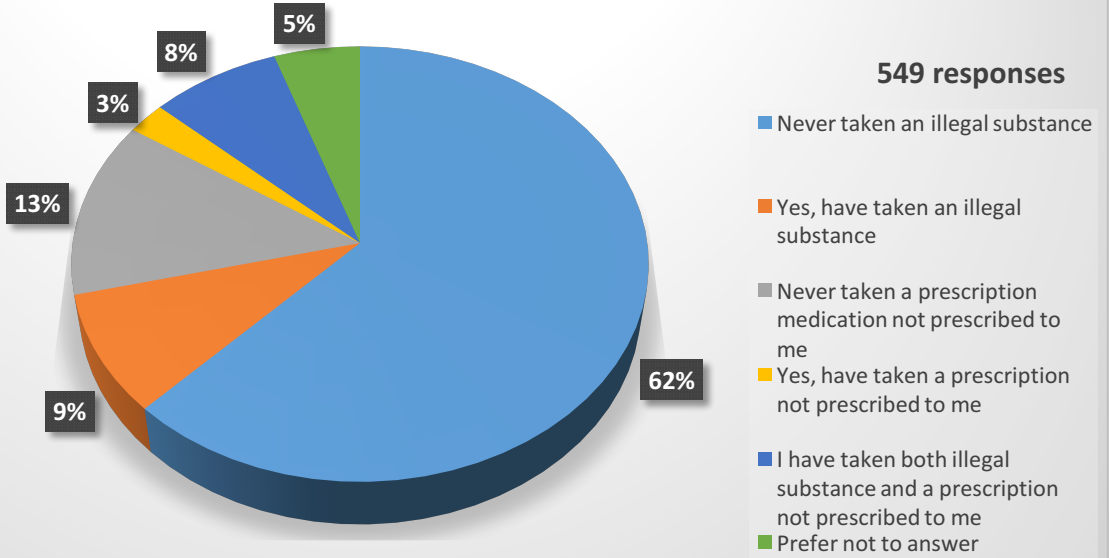

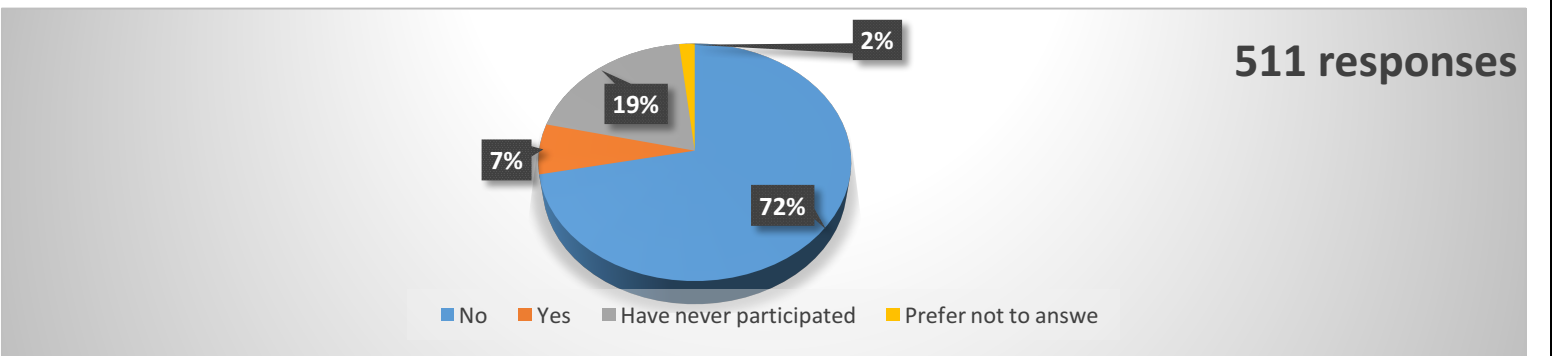

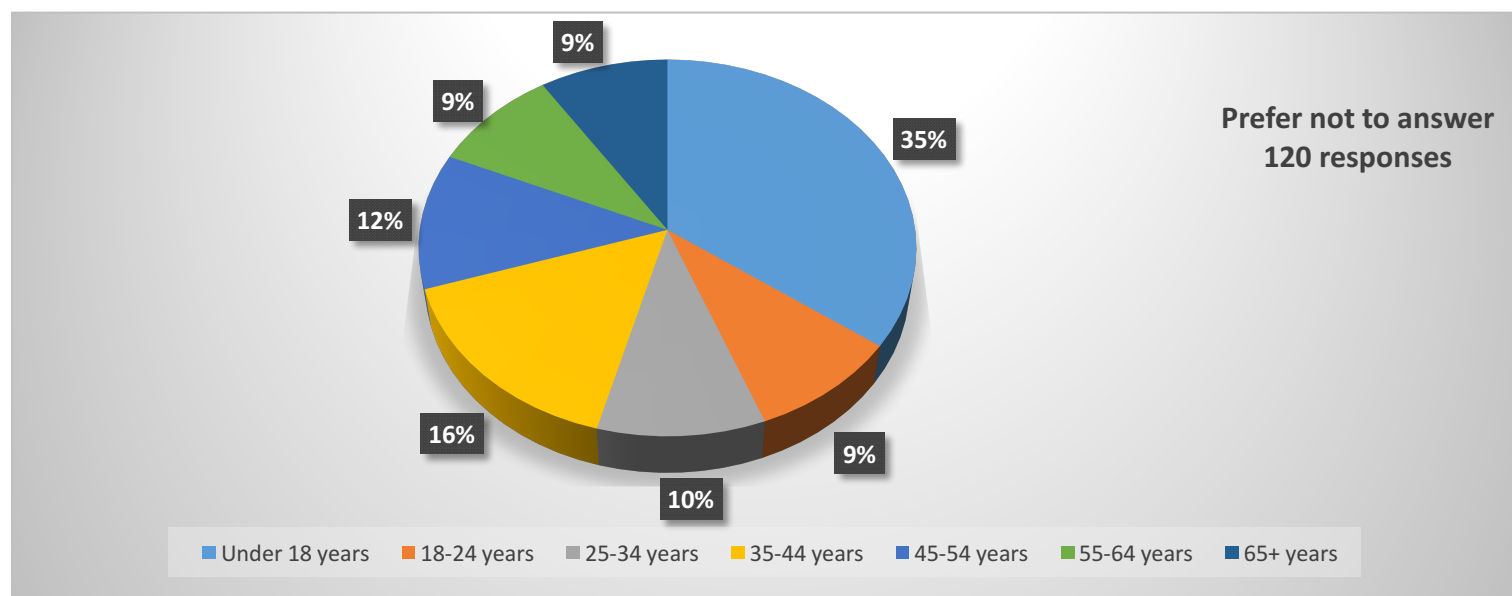

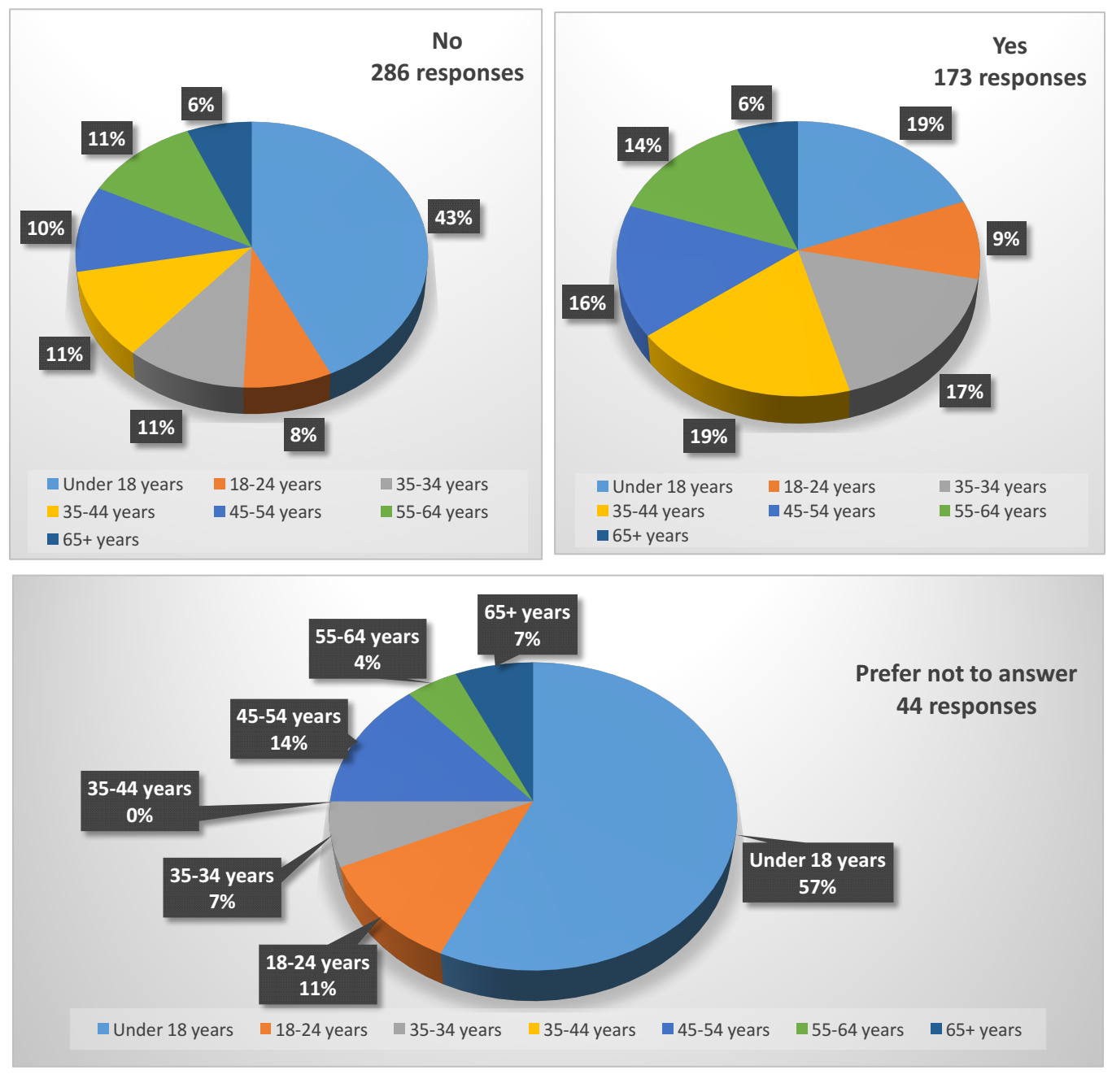

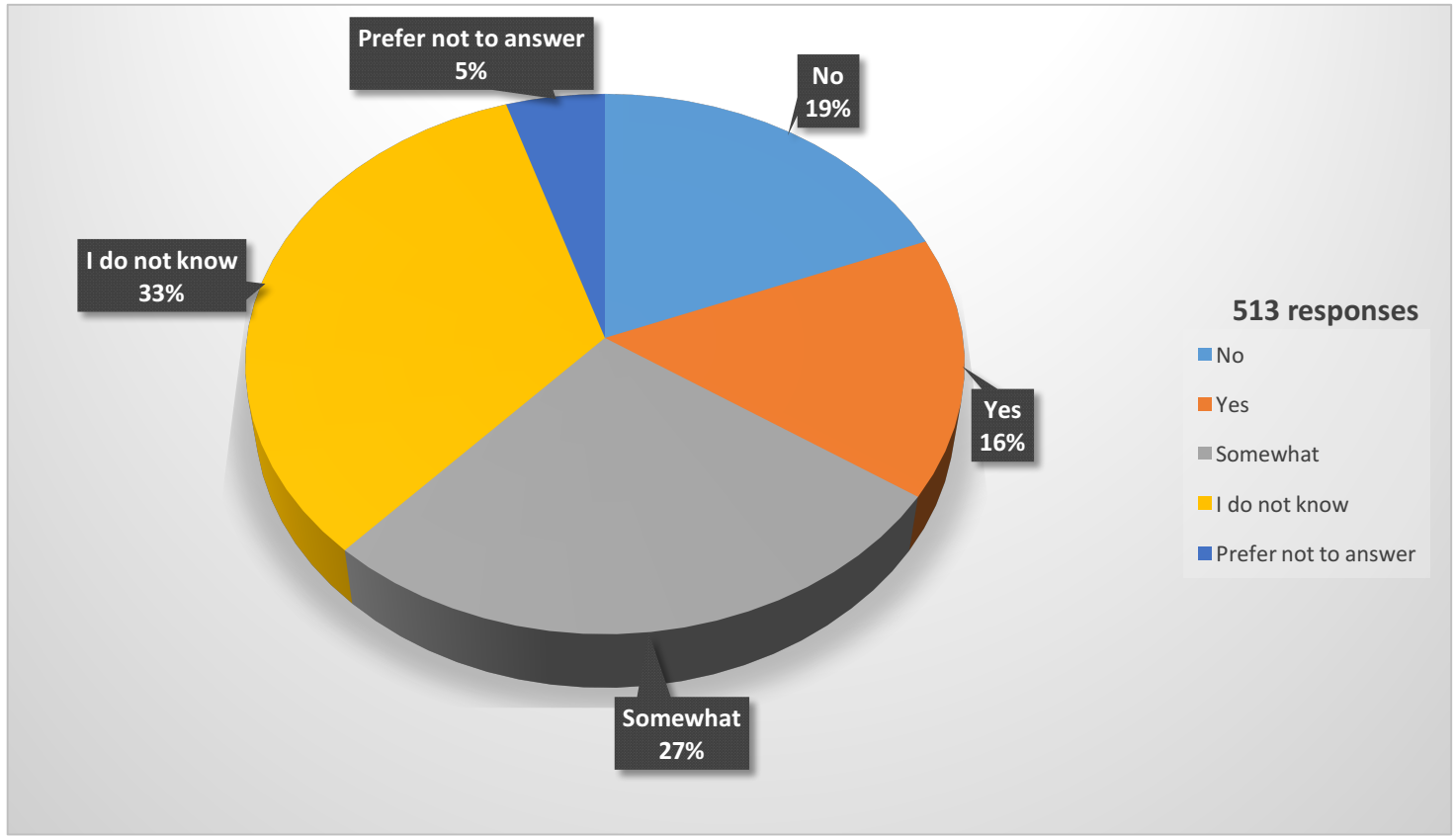

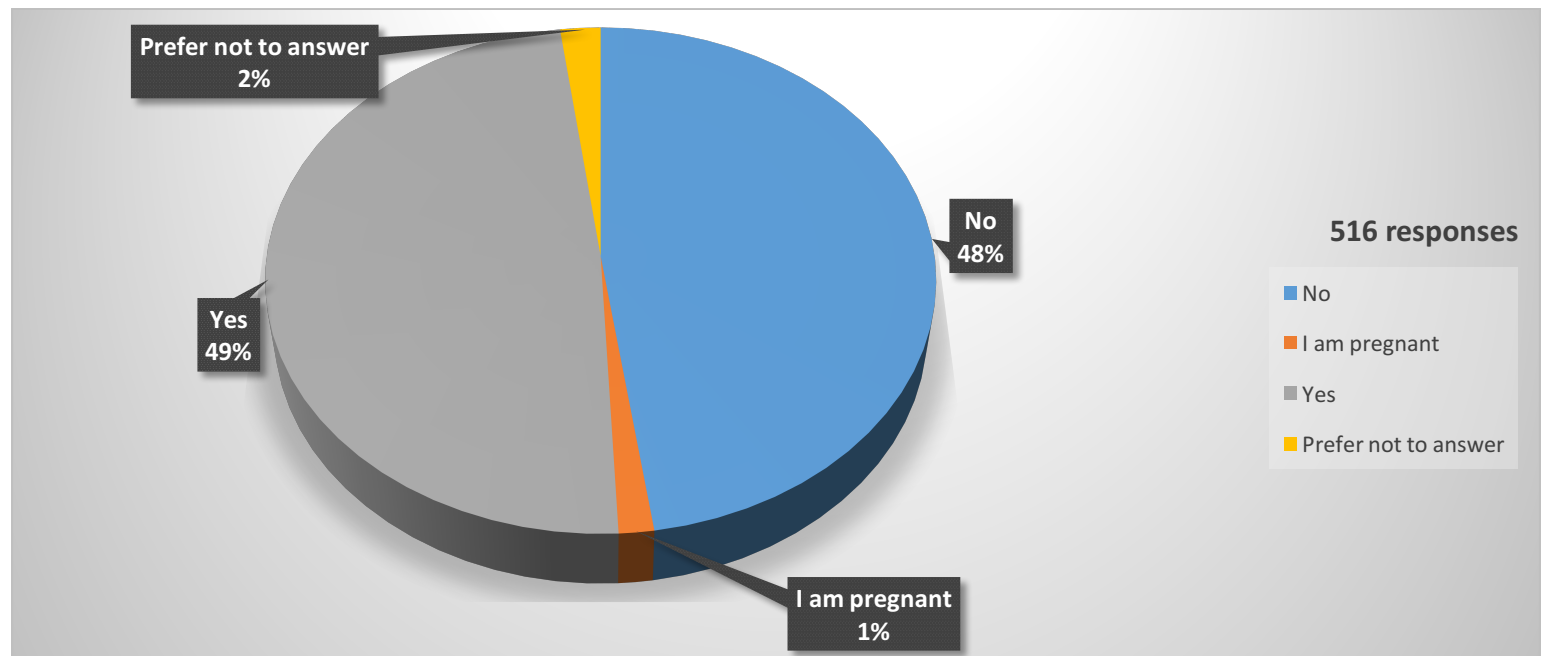

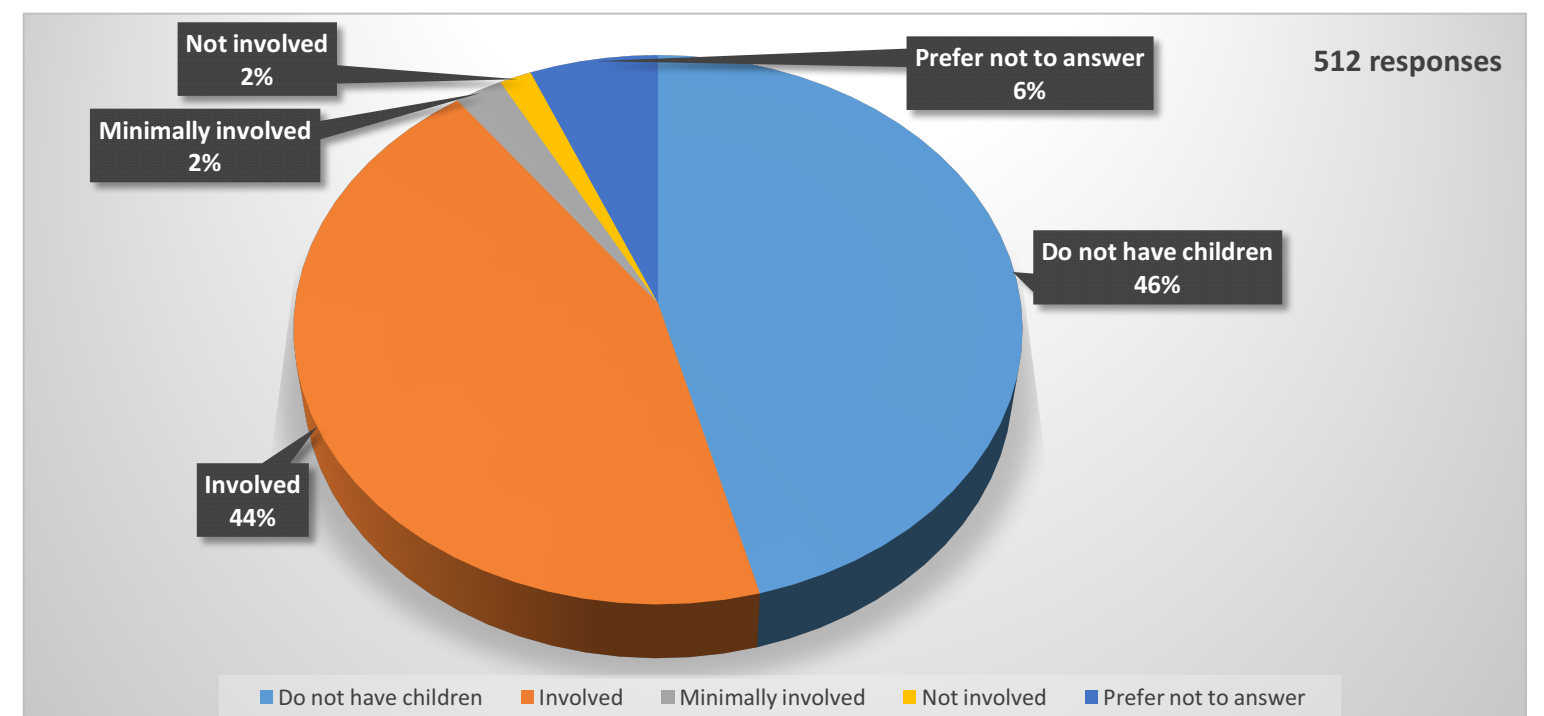
Charted responses to Miami County community needs assessment question 18.
