PERU AIRPORT MANAGERS REPORT FOR JANUARY 2023

For the month of January, the Peru Municipal Airport sold 33.220 gallons of Jet A and 130.380 gallons of 100LL. On January 25th the Airport got about 5 inches of wet snow. It took me and Chris Solida 8 hours on January 26th but still had the Airport closed because the snow that fell melted but froze so it wasn't till January 27th before we could reopen the Airport. The F-250 snow blade stick up so luckily, we had the Chevy Truck as a backup so we were able to get the snow plowing done. Found out later we had a stuck valve on the F-250 so I was able to unstick it a day later. Really proud of Chris Solida because on the Chevy Truck the snow plow was acting up really bad but Chris was able to work with it.

We do have about 100 feet of fence down on the Southwest end of the Airport. Not sure how it happened as when I called the Sheriff's Department there is no record of a crash in that area.

We need to talk about Chris Solida because over the years he has been a really big help so if we can do something for him that would be great. We are very lucky he has been able to help when we really needed it.

We did get a contract proposal from Waste Management for 3 years. Under the old contract we are paying \$181.00 a month and this new proposal is \$85.00 a month.

Andy Jeffers land rent is due and he is paying \$10.00 a month so we need to decide on what to do about his rent.

I hate to do this but with the upcoming budget talks I was wondering if the Aviation Board could help me on my salary. I love my career but my number one job is keeping everyone safe and this is something I take seriously. I am on call 24/7 and I have gotten calls very late about when our fuel system breaks, I'll go out and try to fix it mostly it's the credit card reader so I'm not afraid to help out even if it's well after I get off work. When it comes to snow plowing this is something that has to be done right because people's lives depend on how well you get the airport plowed off. It's the same way with the fuel system because it has to maintained right for everyone's safety.
