- A. Call to Order 7:00 PM

- C. Roll Call Mark McIver, Karl Rosenow, Jim Clary
- D. Parke Speth was introduced to the BOAC as a candidate to fill the open Board seat. Parke's qualifications include:
 - Pilot with plane based at Peru
 - · Graduate of United States Military Academy at West Point
 - Army Officer and tank commander
 - Senior purchasing manager for Indianapolis based residential housing contractor

A motion recommending the mayor appoint Parke Speth to the BOAC was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0.

- E. Approval of September 13, 2022, minutes. A motion to approve the September 13, 2022, Minutes was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0
- F. Financial Report September is not closed

A motion to accept the September financial report was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0

- G. Special Reports
 - a. Managers' Report Written Report Attached
 - i. Reported the FAA safety seminar planned for 10/22/2022, 10:00 am is a go and anticipates a good attendance. 25+ Promotional flyers will be distributed to area airports, posted on the airport Facebook Page.

ii. Kelly requested the purchase of a snow deflector for the John Deere Tractor at a cost of \$550.

A motion to purchase the deflector was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0.

b. Fuel report – Our September fuel order with AvFuel was not clearly communicated. We did receive 4,000 gallons of Jet A but did not receive 4,000 gallons of 100LL. Fuel cost prices were revised and reviewed. Peru can remain competitive in the area market with a \$5.75 retail price. The board affirmed the September motion to purchase 4,000 gallons of 100LL.

c. Hanson Report - Joe Worley

i. Requested approval to submit the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan to construct new T-hangars, a New commercial hangar, ramp space and taxiways. The plan will start in 2023 with the design phase concluding with construction in 2028.

A motion was made and seconded to approve submittal of the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan to the FAA. The motion carried 3/0

ii. Reported a new backup generator system could cost as much as \$95,000. The figure was based on a recent installation at another airport.

H. Unfinished /Old Business

- a. AT&T Service Kelly reported the AT&T bill will increase to around \$120 for the single line currently used by the airport. Recommendation to drop the landline and use VoIP service offered by our Internet Service Provider at an estimated cost of \$15 \$20 / monthly.
- b. New Security System The contractor requested \$13,420.94 up front for the system and installation. There were questions regarding the payment and system. Board asked Jim Clary to discuss with Curtis Greis (RediTech) and report.
- c. Discussed the status of the WIFI covering the T-hangars. It was decided to move forward with the repair of WIFI service in the T-hangars at a cost of \$1,544. An estimated \$700 to rent a lift was rejected. The BOAC will attempt to secure a lift from another city department.

A motion to approve \$1,544 for equipment and labor to support the WIFI signal in the T-hangars was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0

- d. Joe Worley presented economic impact cards/flyers prepared by INDOT. Corrections to the runway strength will be made and the card can be distributed.
- e. Reported the runway crack sealing is in progress
- f. Karl reported on a meeting with Sweet Aviation in Fort Wayne regarding airport development and income generating activities such as:
 - i. Flight School
 - ii. Private investment
- New Business Jim reported the REMC approved installing a directional sign to the airport on the corner of 100 North and US 31.

A motion to purchase directional signs for the REMC and intersection of CR 100N and 400W locations at a cost not to exceed \$900 was made and seconded. The motion carried 3/0.
