You Da Real MVP

Have you ever wondered who takes care of the unkempt lawns throughout the City? Have you ever driven past a property one day and noticed it has dramatically improved just weeks later? This phenomena is the Code Enforcement Crew (CEC) contracted by the City of Peru's Building Department. Each year two temporary workers are contracted from March through October to do code enforcement work for the city, including mowing unkempt yards, trash and debris pickup, and bulky item pickup in direct violation of city code.

"This is a dangerous job," says Building Commissioner Jerry Santen, noting the workers en-

counter harmful insects, animals, and other dangers lurking in the tall grasses and trash piles they work with.


"These guys are our boots on the ground," says Code Enforcement Administrative Assistant Rebecca Thoden.

In addition to the physical aspect of the job, the workers also need to be well-versed in technology, as photographs are used to document the code violations and serve as physical evidence should any discrepancies arise.

The search is currently underway to fill the last remaining position, but it should be filled by mid-March according to Building Commissioner Jerry Santen.
